Dear Ms Newell

I acknowledge receipt of your Email message of 22<sup>nd</sup> August, and note your confirmation that you will not be making any further changes to your Draft Recommendation.

I would remind you, however, that we told you on 11<sup>th</sup> July that we would be unable to handle further work on this matter during August. We received your 'final version' on 29<sup>th</sup> July and a date of 5<sup>th</sup> September was set for our two-page submission.

I am therefore astonished that you should seek, at four days notice, to unilaterally change this agreed date to 26<sup>th</sup> August, thus actively preventing us from presenting our case. One reason you give for wishing to make this change is particularly baffling: there are no Bank holidays after the agreed date of 5<sup>th</sup> September until Christmas. But whatever your reasons might be, you are seeking to deny us the opportunity to correct factual errors that persist in your text. Furthermore, our relatively cursory glance at your recommendation has revealed a potential libel in the document as it stands.

We find this totally unacceptable: you have no right to change the date that has been agreed, and this matter should not go forward to the ASA council until we have had the opportunity to scrutinize your document properly for factual errors and to make our supplementary statement in the context of your actual final version.

We shall be sending copies of this email to Mr Guy Parker, and also to relevant MPs who, we think, should be informed of the situation.
